It is one of the most popular musical and scenic masterpieces of the twentieth century. The medieval evocation served as Orff's inspiration, drawing on the discovery of stories and fragments of songs and poems praising fortune and love unto death. The Stravinsky influence in Orff's musical texture is evident; inspiration almost always finds support in the knowledge that resides within every creator.

Personally, I wanted to inspire the numerous scenes of the choreography of "Carmina Burana," which I created for the National Ballet of Kosovo, precisely by evoking the knowledge and admiration I had through my experiences with some of the great twentieth-century choreographers with whom I collaborated, especially Uwe Scholz, a German choreographer who left an indelible mark on my life and on dance. recalling it in the music of another artist from his own country, namely Carl Orff, in scenes that follow one another between neoclassical, modern and plastic dance, as well as primitive play, in an abstract and surreal setting.
